THE FRENCH SENATE AND THE MUSEE DU LUXEMBOURG

Built in 1615 as a palace for Marie de Medicis- Queen of France as the second wife of King Henry IV of France - and nested in a luxuriant park, the Palais du Luxembourg, now the home of the French Senate, is made accessible to AFPOB for an exceptional tour and luncheon by private invitation by Madame Joelle Garriaud-Maylam, Senator representing the French citizen living abroad.

In 1750 the Palais hosted the first French museum open to the public "Le Musée du Luxembourg", which was then relocated in a separate building next door. This is where we will actually start our day, as we will discover an extensive exhibit around the French Impressionist Camille Pissarro presenting a hundred pieces from the largest private and museum collections around the world through to an intimate tour before the doors open to the public.
