This past November The work of George Balanchine was honored with performances by American Ballet Theater, Paris Opera Ballet, Joffrey Ballet, Mariinsky Ballet, Miami City Ballet, The Royal Ballet and San Francisco ballet. In addition, the music was presented by the New York City Ballet Orchestra. It was a magical night many were happy to participate in.



2018 Scholarship Program

This year has been very successful for Paris Opera Ballet School scholarship program, which AFPOB has funded scholarships for since 2013. Every summer, we help send a number of American students to study with some of the best teachers in the world at the Paris Opera Ballet school. Additionally we send students to a reciprocal program allowing for 3 young men and women from the Paris Opera Ballet school to participate in the summer program at the San Francisco Ballet school. AFPOB is proud to have supported 12 American dancers in the summer school exchange, 10 American dancers in the summer school program, and 3 French dancers in the San Francisco ballet summer intensive this year.

This was a very successful and diverse year as students attended from 55 countries, and students from Kazakhstan, South Korea, and Bulgaria attended for the first time. All together there were 72 returning students to the program. We are excited to continue this program and see young talented dancers grow and continue on into professional settings.


Whats Ahead in 2019!


